A : Andrew Hepburn, Clerk, born in Raphoe, Ireland the 29 July 1849, (son of William Hepburn, Weaver of Raphoe & Frances McConaghy) married (1°) Mary Jane Sands (born in October 1858 in Co. Down, Ireland and died the 7 May 1902 in Manhattan, NY, daughter of Samuel Sands and Nancy Anne), (2°) Mary Jane Jamison, the 28 November 1873 in Brooklyn, NYC (born in 1854 in Raphoe, Ireland, daughter of Hugh Jamison and Mary Bradley).

He had at least 5 children :

B.1 : (2) Frances Hepburn, born in New York USA in August 1875, died in 1912, married Martin David Chalmers, the 23 November 1898 in Manhattan, NY (born in December 1875 in New York USA, son of Thomas Chalmers and Mary McNeil).

She had at least 2 children :

C.1.1 : Frances J. Chalmers, born in New York USA in June 1899.

C.1.2 : Martin David Chalmers, born in New York USA the 28 October 1901.

B.2 : (2) Mary Jane Hepburn, born in Manhattan, NY the 27 February 1878, married Joseph Kennedy, the 7 November 1898 in Manhattan, NY.

B.3 : (2) Jane Hepburn, born in Manhattan, NY the 15 March 1880.

B.4 : (1) William John Hepburn, born in New York City, NY the 15 April 1884, Foreman, married Edith Tretjers, in 1908 (born in 1893 in New Jersey USA).
